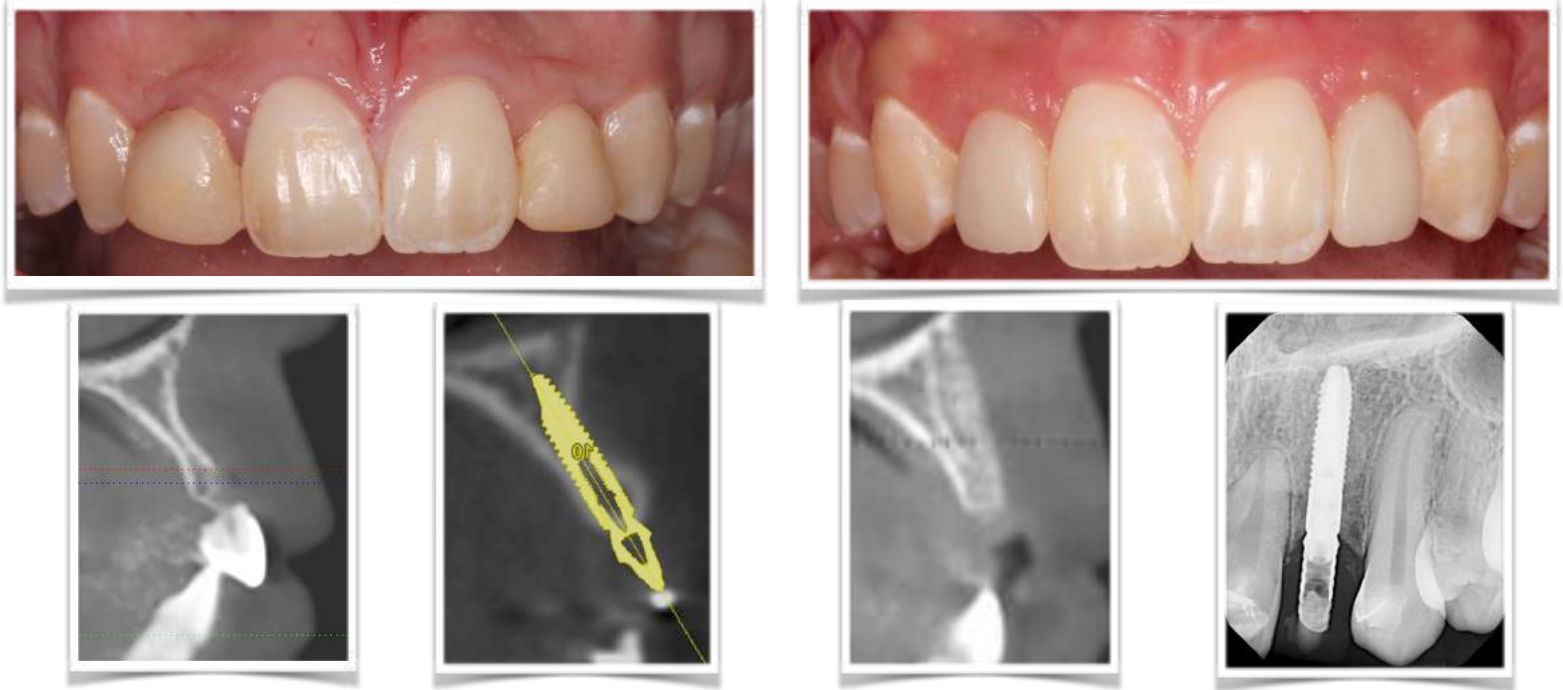


Demystifying Bone Grafting: Current Philosophies, Techniques, and Materials
